## Dates in **History**

1305 William Wallace, who led the Scottish resistance and won the Battle at Sirling Bridge, was later captured near Glasgow. In London, Wallace was tried and executed for high treason by Edward I of England on August 23, 1305.

1590 On August 17, 1590, John White, the governor of the Roanoke Island colony in present-day North Carolina, returned from a supply-trip to England to find the settlement deserted. White and his men found no trace of the 100 or so colonists he left behind three years earlier, and there was no sign of violence.

At 3:14 pm on 10 August 1675, England's 1675 first Astronomer Royal John Flamsteed laid the foundation stone of the new Royal Observatory. King Charles II appointed Sir Christopher Wren, a former professor of astronomy at Oxford to oversee the design. Later, in the 20th century, Flamsteed House and the Observatory became part of Royal Museums Greenwich.

1865 Alice's Adventures in Wonderland was published August 2, 1865. A fantasy novel written by English mathematician Charles Lutwidge Dudgson under the pseudonym Lewis Carroll, it tells of a girl named Alice falling through a rabbit hole into a fantasy world. The tale plays with logic, giving the story lasting popularity with adults as well as with children.

US atomic submarine USS Nautilus left Pearl Harbor naval base heading north and crossed under the North Pole at 2315 on August 3, 1958. "Operation Sunshine" was a testing ground for the sub and also an opportunity for the Navy to experiment with magnetic and gyro-compass navigational equipment.
