Dates in History

1455 On May 22nd, the War of the Roses began. The war was a civil war between the houses of Lancaster and York. The war was limited to English nobility and involved few of the populace.

May 19th, John III Sobieski was elected King of Poland and Grand Duke of Lithuania. One of the most notable monarchs of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth. Sobieski's military skill contributed to the Commonwealth's stabilization, much needed after the turmoil of the Deluge and the Khmelnytsky Uprising. An able military commander, he was most famous for his victory over the Turks at the 1683 Battle of Vienna.

On May 17th, two dozen merchants and brokers established the New York Stock Exchange. In good weather they operated under a buttonwood tree on Wall Street. In bad weather they moved inside to a coffeehouse to conduct business.

Decoration Day was first observed on May 5th 1865 in the U.S., with the tradition of decorating soldiers' graves from the Civil War with flowers. The observance date was later moved to May 30th and included American graves from World War I and World War II. and became better known as Memorial Day. In 1971, Congress moved Memorial Day to the last Monday in May, thus creating a three-day holiday weekend.

On May 1st, an American U-2 spy plane 1960 flying at 60,000 feet was shot down over Sverdlovsk in central Russia on the eve of a summit meeting between President Dwight D. Eisenhower and Soviet Russia's Premier Nikita Khrushchev. The sensational incident caused a cancellation of the meeting and heightened existing Cold War tensions.
