Dates in History

- 1799 On November 12th, Andrew Ellicott
 Douglass, an early American astronomer born
 in Vermont, witnessed the Leonids meteor
 shower from a ship off the Florida Keys.
 Douglas wrote these findings in his journal
 which would later become known as the first
 known meteor shower in North America.
