Dates in History

1869 Young Tom Morris, a four-time Open Champion, is known for golf's first recorded hole-in-one on the 166-yard, par-3, eighth hole of Prestwick's original 12-hole course on September 16th.

1897 French nuclear physicist Iréne Joliot-Curie, was born September 12 to Marie and Pierre Curie, and was later the joint recipient of the 1935 Nobel Prize for chemistry, with her husband Jean Frédéric Joliot-Curie.

Was admired as one of the best defensive shortstops and for his leadership, becoming the youngest manager in baseball history when he briefly took the reins of the New York Yankees on September 12th at the age of 23. Described as the "calmest man in baseball," Peckinpaugh's steadying influence later helped the Washington Senators to their only world championship, and won him the 1925 Most Valuable Player Award, making him the first shortstop in baseball history to receive the honor.

1916 Francis Scott Key Fitzgerald, the American novelist, whose first names were taken from the writer of the American national anthem, was born on September 24th and is best known as F. Scott Fitzgerald.

On September 6th, Gay Kelleway took part in a horse race in England with a TV camera fixed to her helmet. Gay is still the first and only woman to have ridden a winner at Royal Ascot. She was the youngest-ever amateur champion at 18, the first woman to ride in the Royal Ascot Gold Cup and the first jockey of either gender to wear a camera in her helmet.
